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Developing The Entrepreneurial Spirit Of Santri (Gen Z): Challenges And Strategies

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Abstract

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Generation Z, born between 1997 and 2012, represents a new generation with unique characteristics that distinguish them from previous generations. They are known as digital natives, cerative individuals, and prosses a high entrepreneurial spirit. In Indonesia, "santri" are a group of young people with the potential to develop their entrepreneurial spirit.

This research aims to analyze the development of the entrepreneurial spirit among santri (Gen Z) at Pondok Modern Tazzaka, focusing on the challenges and startegies faced. The research method used is qualitative with data collection techniques including interviews, observations, and document studies. The results show several challenges in developing the entrepreneurial spirit of santri at Pondok Modern Tazzaka, namely: Lack of structured entrepreneurship curriculum and programs; Limited access to capital and informations; A santri culture that is more focussed on religious studies; Lack of guidance and mentoring from entrepreneurs. Strategies that can be implemented to overcome these challenges are: Developing a structured and comprehensive entrepreneur curriculum and programs; Improving access to capital and information for santri; fFostering an entrepreneurial culture within the pesantren environment; Strengthening guidance and mentoring from entrepreneurs.

INTRODUCTION

In the fast-paced era of globalization, developing an entrepreneurial spirit is a crucial aspect of enhancing individual competitiveness, especially among the younger generation. Generation Z, known as Gen Z, consists of individuals born between 1997 and 2012 who have grown up in a highly technology-connected environment. Gen Z exhibits unique characteristics such as a high dependence on technology, a willingness to innovate, and resilience in the face of the change (David Stillman & Jonah Stillman, 2017).

In the context of education in Indonesia, islamic boarding schools, known as "pondok pesantren", play a significant role in shaping the character and skills of their students, known as "santri". Pondok Modern Tazzaka, as on of these islamic educational institutions, has the responsibility not only to teach religious knowledge but also to prepare santri to be competitive in

entrepreneurship education must integrate theory with practical application, thus developing practical skills and an entrepreneurial mindset in students (Shabbir & Di Gregorio, 1996).

According Badan Pusat Statistik (BPS) in 2021, the number of santri in Indonesia reached 5.9 million. Santri prossess several potentials that can be develop to become entrepreneurs (Arifah, 2024), including: 1) High work ethic, 2) High social spirit; 3) Extensive networks; 4) Strong religious values.

The development of the entrepreneurial spirit among santri is one of the efforts to improve the welfare of the santri and the community at large. Entrepreneurial santri can play a role in creating jobs and boosting the national economy (Dwi, et al, 204).

Several studies have been conducted on developin the entrepreneurial spirit among santri. This development can be achieved through various programs such as training, seminars, and mentoring (Syarofi, 2017). Research by (Falah, 2018) shows that the factors influencing the development of the entrepreneurial spirit among santri include motivation, knowledge, skills, and environment.

Previous research also indicates that entrepreneurship education must encompass both theoretical and practical aspects to equip students with the necessary knowledge and skills. (Fayolle & Gailly, 2015) stated, "Entrepreneurship education can increase entrepreneurial attitudes and intentions among students" (p.75). this underscores the importance of integrating entrepreneurship curriculum into the pesantren education system to forster an entrepreneurial spirit in santri from an early age.

Pondok Modern Tazzaka has initiated various entrepreneurship programs to equip santri with the skills and knowledge neede to become entrepreneurs. These programs aim to create santri who not only prossess deep religious knowledge but are also economically independent and positively contribute to society. However, the implementation of these programs faces several challenges that require special attention.

(Peter Ferdinand Drucker, 1986) emphasized that "innovation and entrepreneurship are key elements in economic progress" (p. 9). This indicates that developing an entrepreneurial spirit in pesantren impacts not only the individual santri but also overall economic development. A study (Mandiri et al., n.d.) also highlited the importance of entrepreneurial management in dynamic business environment, furthur underscoring the need for adequate entrepreneurship education in pondok pesantren.

METHODS

Types and Methods of Data Collection

This study uses qualitative methods, with data collection technique as follows:

- Interviews: Conducted with santri, pesantren caregivers, and santri entrepreneur alumni.
- **Observations**: Conducted in the pesantren environment, including classes, mosques, and santri cooperatives.
- **Documentation Studies :** Conducted by collecting documents related to the development of the entrepreneurial spirit of santri at Pondok Modern Tazzaka.

Data Analysis Methods

The collected data analyzed using qualitative data analysis methods, namely:

- Data Reduction: Simplifying, summarizing, and focusing the obtained data
- Data Presentation: presenting reduced data in the form of narratives, tables, and diagrams.
- **Conclusion Drawing :** Conclusions are drawn based on the data that has been presented and analyzed.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

Survei Data Analysis

The survei conducted at Pondok Modern Tazzaka with Gen Z santri provides an overview of their understanding, motivation, support, and readiness in developing an entrepreneurial spirit. Here is a detailed analysis of the survei data:

• Respondent Demographics

a. Total respondents: 32 santri

b. Age: 17-27 years

c. Gender: All male (100%)

d. Year of Entry to the Pesantren: Various, ranging from 2012 to 2023

• Types of Programs/Business Unites Involved:

Santri are involved in various entrepreneurial programs at the pesantren, such as Tazko, Tazko Point, Rifugo Konfeksi, and other business units. These programs give them the opportunity to experience running a business firsthand.

• Understanding of Entrepreneurship Concepts:

- a. The majority of respondents (80%) feel "Understand" the entrepreneurship concepts taught at the pesantren.
- b. Only a small portion (20%) feel "Less Understanding" and require more explanation and mentoring to grasp to the concepts better.

• Motivation to Become Entrepreneurs:

Respondents show a high level of motivation, with 70% feeling "Motivated" and 30% "Very Motivated" to become entrepreneurs after participating in the entrepreneurship program at the pesantren.

• Suport from Family and Friends:

- a. Support from family and friends varies greatly, with 60% feeling "Supportive" and 25% "Very Supportive".
- b. About 15% of respondents feel the support they receive is "Less Supportive", indicating a need for increased socialization about the importance of entrepreneurship to families and friends.

• Satisfaction with Entrepreneurship Programs:

- a. Satisfaction with the results of entrepreneurial spirit development varies, with 50% of respondents feeling "Satisfaction", 30% "Very Satisfied", and 20% "Somewhat Satisfied"
- b. This satisfaction indicates that the existing programs are quite effective, but there is still need improvement.

• Readiness to Start a Business:

- a. About 40% of respondents feel "Ready" and 35% "Quite Ready" to start their own business after completing their education at the pesantren.
- b. The remaining 25% feel **"Very Ready"**, showing high confidence among some santri.

• Suggestions or Feedback for Entrepreneurship Programs :

Some respondents provided suggestions to improve the entrepreneurship programs at the pesantren, including increasing the frequency of training, adding more practical materials, and enhancing cooperation with external entrepreneurs.

I. Challenges in Developing the Entrepreneurial Spirit of Santri

The research results indicate several challenges in developing the entrepreneurial spirit of santri at Pondok Modern Tazzaka, which include:

- Lack of structured and comprehensive entrepreneurship curriculum and programs:
 Pondok Modern Tazzaka does not yet have a structured and comprehensive entrepreneurship curriculum and program. This results in santri not receiving sufficient preparation to become entrepreneurs.
- Limited access to capital and information: Santri have limited access to capital and information to start a business. This is because santri generally come from underprivileged families and have limited access to information technology.
- Santri culture focused more on religious studies: The culture at Pondok Modern Tazzaka is still more focussed on religious studies than on entrepreneurship. This causes santri to lack strong motivation to become entrepreneurs.
- Lack of mentoring and guidance from entrepreneurs: Santri do not receive sufficient mentoring and guidance from entrepreneurs. This results in santri not having role models and not knowing how to start and develop a business.

2. Strategies for Developing the Entrepreneurial Spirit of Santri

Based on the research results, several strategies that can be implemented to overcome these challenges are:

- Developing a structured and comprehensive entrepreneurship curriculum and programs: Pondok Modern Tazzaka needs to develop a structured and comprehensive entrepreneurship curriculum and programs. The curriculum and programs should include material on entrepreneurship, such as: 1) Entrepreneurship concepts; 2) Entrepreneurial skills; 3) Entrepreneurial mindset.
- Increasing access to capital and information for santri: Pondok Modern Tazzaka needs to establish collaborations with finansial institutions and other organizations to increase access to capital for santri. Additionally, the pesanren should also provide easy access to information for santri such as: 1) Information on business opportunities; 2) Information on entrepreneurship training and seminars; 3) Information on Business permits.
- Fostering an entrepreneurial culture in the pesantren environment: Pondok Modern Tazzaka needs to foster an entrepreneurial culture in the pesantren environment. This can be done by: 1) Organizing seminars and workshops on entrepreneurship; 2) Holding entrepreneurship competitors; 3) Giving awards to santri who excel in entrepreneurship.
- Strengthening mentoring and guidance from entrepreneurs: Pondok Modern Tazzaka needs to strengthen mentoring and guidance from entrepreneurs for santri. This

can be done by: 1) Inviting entrepreneurs to give talks and motivation to santri; 2) Establishing a mentoring program between santri and entrepreneurs; 3) Faciliting santri to attend entrepreneurship training and seminars.

CONCLUSION

This research shows that developing an entrepreneurial spirit at Pondok Modern Tazzaka faces various challenges, including limited access to practical training and entrepreneurial resources, limited practical experience, and lack of support from family and friends. However, with the right strategies, such as increasing access to training, forming parterships, integrating entrepreneurship curriculum, and utilizing technology, these challenges can be overcome. Pondok Modern Tazzaka has great potential to create santri who are not only knowledgeable in religion but also independent and positively contribute to society through entrepreneurship.

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
