Repetition can also be tied into games, habits, or daily activities, taking an approach that seeks to deepen pronunciation (Sanchez, 2022). The teacher also introduces interesting ways to further encourage students to study pronunciation by reading books frequently and practicing them.

Hakim, M. A. R. R. (2019) further adds that the ability to read, write, remember information and interact with others effectively are skills that can focus on learning better so that they can motivate themselves to learn more.

Based on the explanation above, we have seen that the indispensable thing is pronunciation and students should learn pronunciation from an early age. So that they are used in their daily lives in applying English pronunciation in an interesting and fun way by encouraging students to be more interested in learning English (Noge et al., 2020).

This will also be very good for their learning process. Thus, they can express their opinions in front of other students so that other students wonder and discussions arise through interactions between them. This is what can build their communication to be better with the discussion that begins with this literacy activity.

To implement this, the role of a teacher is the main key before learning begins, the spirit of reading students who have been familiarized before entering the classroom.

A culture of literacy must always be cultivated so that they can develop the habit of critical thinking through the reading process, which produces work through this activity (Mursalim, 2017). - 3. Students who are observed as objects may not fully lead to the object observed by the researcher.
- 4. Research that can only observe students' reading activities at school and not when they are at home.
- 5. This type of research is descriptive qualitative which is where the understanding of the research subject towards their environment so that it is possible that there is a discrepancy between the research objectives and the understanding of the source. Researchers strive for this study to describe well the data obtained and in accordance with the facts.

Therefore, this literacy culture greatly affects students in reading culture with their ability to think critically (Muhammad et al., 2019). This will also help them in interpersonal and social communication which aims to develop and practice their skills. This includes giving their opinions to others so that they are more likely to accept their arguments in effective group work.

They fill their free time to develop this culture of reading such as, during free time, break time, sometimes they do it when they are bored. Good habits will reflect a good person as well. The effectiveness of this ongoing literacy culture will have an impact on their better thinking skills.

Conclusion
